Some of us were privileged to attend the funeral of Ray Axford a short while ago. I would like to take this opportunity to add a small tribute of my own.

When I was asked to write a few words about Ray and what he had done for the sport I was lost for words. Not because I did not know him but because he always seemed to me to be 'there'... usually telling me off because he thought I was wrong. Which I was, sometimes.

I believe the first time I met Ray was when I was shooting at Harvington Archers and he, pus a couple of others turned up in the middle of their FITA shoot nearby.

I have now known him for over 40 years.

He was heavily involved in the Invicta Coaching group as a coach and a trainer of coaches. He is obviously most famous as the author of a book called 'Archery Anatomy' which (and I have just checked this) is still available on Amazon. I also found that his work has been quoted by a

large number of groups (including physiotherapists) all over the world. Those of us who look at other archery books, articles and so so often look at a diagram and say 'I know where that came from'. This skill in drawing, I believe, stemmed from the work he did at Lesney (the Matchbox toy company).

It always seemed to me that he sometimes disagreed with people for the sake of making them think about their techniques in the sport and the methods of coaching they adopted a good technique when you got used to it!

He was a member of Harvington Archers (where he was treasurer and newsletter editor), Beckenham Bowmen and Wellcome Archers but later moved to the coast where he was a founder member of a club called Romney Marsh Bowmen. Being Ray everything had to be done correctly and I am told it was. Crystal Palace Bowmen were privileged to have him as 'Lord Paramount' at their 2011 Open Shoot when I know he enjoyed chatting to old friends.. mind you he had one or two pithy comments to make about some archers' styles.

In the period after he lost his coaching certificate through ill health and not being able to coach he continued to work on the design of a new riser which I am told would have worked well had it have gone into production. He was awarded 'Emeritus' status by the Kent Archery Association four years ago as an appreciation of his work in the sport.

I will miss Ray, not just because he was a foil against which one could check thoughts and techniques but also because he had so much knowledge of the sport of archery and that knowledge, which was available to those who asked, has gone.

I will miss him as a friend.



AGB and membership forms!!

To say that I am less than happy with the way in which AGB have rammed through changes without consulting those who do the work by way of club secretaries and county officers would be an understatement.

Unfortunately all seems to be a done deal so I would welcome peoples' thoughts about what we do next. Up until now KAA has used the same forms that were sent to AGB as a record of who is a KAA member and who is not. This was useful if there was a query at a tournament and so on. These forms also had contact details by way of addresses and so on (please note that after 12 months I had the interesting job of shredding the lot!). So the question is where do we go from here. Clearly I do need to know who are KAA members and how much clubs need to pay KAA / SCAS but I want to keep things simple for clubs.

My suggestion is this. Use the forms that AGB allow you to print out when you do your on line stuff, print up a copy of the Excel spreadsheet that I have sent out to all clubs to work out the money side of things and send them to me.

Unless any one else has a better idea that is!!

BUT for reasons of fiscal security KAA cannot receive or make BACS transfers. As I have explained we use a multi signature account (for free) that precludes Internet access to the account but does ensure probity and stops any one on the committee (or any one else for that matter) walking off with KAA cash. Having just spoken to a club in another sport near me that has lost about £10k I am happy that we do things the way that we do.
