NOTICES!!

All club membership forms MUST be sent to me by the first of October. Secretaries are asked to ensure that only the new forms issued by AGB are used and that the declaration page at the back is sent as well. All you need to do is to copy the pages you send in to AGB and send one copy to me please (plus the money of course!!)

REMINDER about new members or those changing clubs

While most clubs are very good about this some clubs are still not sending in forms for either new members to the club or archers who have changed clubs during the year. I now receive a list of members from AGB on a regular basis and will be asking questions of those clubs who do not make the correct returns.

AGM

The date of the KAA AGM has been set for November 27th at 2.30 pm and will take place at the home of Medway Archers:-

11.2. A preliminary notice of the A.G.M. shall be sent in writing to all Associated Clubs and Direct Members at least ten weeks prior to the date of the meeting, inviting resolutions for the agenda and nominations for the elections.

11.3. Resolutions for inclusion in the agenda and nominations for elections and applicable Awards of Merit must be received in writing by the Secretary at least five weeks prior to the date of the A.G.M. and must include the signature, name and club name of a proposer and a seconder.

A further notice will be sent out to clubs but this constitutes written notice!!

The KAA Long Bow shoot.. An update and some news

Following a request from a number of archers the committee changed the format of the shoot last year. Unfortunately and despite members saying they wanted it they obviously didn't as so few entered we had to cancel it. Some people asked why we could not run it with just a few and the answer is cost in volunteers time!! To run a shoot we have to mark out the field the day before, set it up early in the morning, provide a scoring party, working party, judges and so on. These people give up their valuable time freely but it is not deemed worth it if too few archers support the shoot.

Two decisions were made at the committee meeting on Monday; Firstly that the old style of two way Long Bow shoot will be held in 2017 Secondly that KAA will try and run a Double 720 in 2017 as well. We have a volunteer to run it and negotiations are under way with Vigo to find a suitable date. I hope to have full details available on line as soon as possible and in the next newsletter. The 720 and the invitation will both be Record Status in 2017 to help those needing ranking points OK.. After all the official stuff here are some pieces of good news:-

Brief report on the SCAS Inter Counties held on the 10th September 2016 at Oxford Rugby Club Long Hinksey Lane Oxford

Kent were represented by 5 teams. Senior recurve, senior compound, senior longbow, senior barebow and junior recurve, shooting a world record status WA1440

The day started wet and remained that way all day from before assembly at 8.00 until 5.30 in the afternoon when a fitful sun started to put in an appearance.

The round finished at 6.30 and all of us gathered to await results. All the archers had mutterings of how badly they had shot but I was very happy with the Kent team putting up with the poor conditions and a long day with no one pulling out and supporting all their team mates.

The results (still provisional) with eleven counties represented. Senior recurve 6th junior recurve 3rd bare bow 2nd compound 2nd and the stalwart longbows came away with 1st place an exceptional performance.
