Neil Dimmock as TO gave an introductory speech to the team Managers to explain procedure and hand out team score sheets for completion at the end of the day.

Then the judges were introduced to the archers and Neil explained that some awards would not be available as they were held by the SCAS secretary who recently resigned, hopefully the awards and medals will be available soon.

People gathered in the university canteen for the results and outside rain disappeared and sun came out typical. The team and individual results were read out. Kent achieved third place longbow, third place recurve and a magnificent 1<sup>st</sup> place individual gents recurve from Graham Souch.

With the match done and provisional scores and awards made we all went home tired and damp, pleased for the winners commiserating with the non winners, and looking forward to September 14<sup>th</sup> 2014 the date of the next Inter Counties.
