Kent Field Championships 2015.

Sunday 18th October 2015 saw the KAA Field Championships 2015 held at the Kent Archery Field Woodstock venue, located near Sittingbourne.

This was the first occasion these Championships have been held since 2008, owing to a slow decline in Field Archery in Kent over recent years.

The response by Kent archers for the 2015 Championships was overwhelming. The course allowed for a maximum of 48 competitors, and the event was full prior to the closing date, with a waiting list in place. In total 41 Kent Archers competed at this event across 5 different bow disciplines. For those who are unfamiliar with field archery, the course consisted of twelve different targets. Competitors were divided into groups of four, and then allocated a starting target on the course. Upon completion of the target, the group would then progress to the next target; in the same way you would progress from hole to hole on a golf course.

The twelve target course was completed twice, with every archer shooting a total of 24 targets. All of the targets on the course were classed as marked targets; this meant that the distance to the target was shown on the shooting peg. Therefore archers were not required to estimate any distances. However, this should not detract from the other challenges the archers encountered on the course. Targets were situated at uphill or downhill angles, and often with difficult terrain underfoot. To give an overview, some of the more challenging targets included a 60cm target face (equal to a standard Portsmouth target face) shot at 45 metres and a 80cm target face (equal to a standard Frostbite target face) shot at 60 metres.

One of the shortest targets on the course, only 10 metres in distance, was situated on the top of a quarry with a 35 degree downhill angle between the archer and the target. This equated to the equivalent of aiming a bow at an item on the ground about 2 metres away from your feet!
