Greetings,

The outdoor season is nearly here, although the winter seems not to have been too bad for outdoor archery on occasions (even I have managed to get a couple of rounds shot, much to the amazement of my club's record officer).

Details are shown of the forthcoming KAA shoots but I would draw the attention of all archers to the new shoot for KAA which is the 'unsighted bow' shoot. Full details are available on the web site bur are summarised later on in this edition.

Rule changes

I would remind all archers of the change in rules for <u>Record Status</u> shoots where archer's equipment is now required to be checked either before (as seems to be happening) or during the shoot. It is also made clear that it is the archer's responsibility to have the correct kit.

So far this does not seem to have been much of a problem but I would emphasise two issues that I have come across:-

Firstly all arrows **must** have either your name or your initials clearly marked on them. It is better to put the details on the arrow than the fletchings (which may come off especially if you have a pass through or similar). Secondly (and this is for bare bows) there must be no markings visible on the back of the bow where they can be seen by the archer. This includes trademarks on the riser. In addition sight blocks, clicker screws etc. should have been removed, the trademarks can be covered with tape.

As a judge I know that all judges will help archers resolve issues where possible but forewarned is forearmed. If you have a query seek advice from either a regular competition archer or from a Judge.

Kent Indoor Report

This year's Kent Indoor championship moved from its normal Remembrance Sunday slot in November to Valentine's Day in February this year. While the total number of round shot this year, 154 was down from last year's 168 the average round score, 464.35 was up on 2014 which was 463.91. To give you some idea over the 3 sessions this year there were 8776 scoring arrows of which 2235 of those scoring arrows were 10's. The total point's value was 71510.
