Peter is a county coach in Kent and has been involved in disability archery for the last 10 years from grass roots to paralympic squad level. He is experienced at coaching a wide range of disabilities and is a member of the British Blind Sport Archery Development team.

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Peter March



Peter started his career as a semi-professional footballer but after two broken legs took up refereeing at premier league level. When Peter's son Lewis discovered archery at the age of 16 he rapidly learnt about supporting a blind archer through the benefits of the British Blind Sport spotters course and a subsequent coach training course.

Paul Panton is a former National Champion in the sport of cycling but for the last 9 years has been working for Kent County Councils - Kent Sports, Leisure and Olympics as a sports development officer specialising in Disability Sport. Paul supports Paralympics athletes and also works at grass roots level to develop Archery and other sports across the county.
