Sport England: Active Women



Sports England £10m fund to increase women's sports participation. Applications must demonstrate that projects will address the specific barriers to participation in sport faced by either:

- Women in disadvantaged communities (the 20% most deprived lower super output areas in the country) or
- Women caring for children under 16.

Projects need to demonstrate how they will increase the number of women playing sport from either one or both of these groups. Faiths in Action Round 2



This £2m scheme is aimed at faith, inter-faith, voluntary and community sector organisations operating at national, regional or local levels in England.

Bids must relate to one or more of the fund's four priorities: Developing the confidence and skills to "bridge" and "link"; Supporting shared spaces for interaction and social action; Developing structures and processes which support dialogue and social action ; Improving opportunities for learning which build understanding.

The maximum size of a grant in Round 2 is £6,000. The scheme will support both new and existing projects, those supporting women and young people are particularly welcomed. **New model constitution
launched for small charities**



The new constitution is designed to provide a concise, practical framework for charities with an income of under £5,000. It uses clear, direct language that is easy to understand, is only 700 words long and covers all the requirements for a very small charity which does not own land or employ staff.

Charities with an income of less than £5,000 do not need to register with the Commission, but are still subject to charity law. If the income of the charity grows larger than £5,000, the charity will need to register with the Commission and will need a more comprehensive governing document. **Further information:**

Comic Relief is now open for applications and provides one to three years grants on average between £25,000 and £40,000 per year, rarely exceeds this upper limit. They have the following programmes:

- **Mental Health** - This programme aims to promote the rights and support the recovery of people who have mental health problems, and to help them feel more included in society. It also aims to reduce the stigma and discrimination faced by people with mental health problems
- **Refugee and Asylum Seeking Women** - This programme aims to provide support for refugee and asylum seeking women who have experienced rape, torture and other forms of violence in their home countries. They are especially keen to make sure that women get the help they need in making their claims for asylum, and also get access to emotional and practical services they need to help rebuild their lives. There are two strands to this programme: direct support to women and training for people working in these areas.
- **Sport for Change** - The aim of this programme is to understand more about how sport can play a part in delivering positive change within the lives of individuals and communities.
- **Young People aged 11-25 Schemes:**
 - Sexually Exploited and Trafficked Young People - This programme aims to reduce harm to young people who have been sexually exploited or trafficked.
 - Young People and Alcohol - This programme will fund services that aim to reduce the levels of young people's drinking, create greater awareness of the dangers of harmful drinking and provide direct support to young drinkers at the greatest risk – those drinking excessively and dangerously.
 - Young People with Mental Health Problems - This programme has two strands: They are keen to fund a range of services and approaches to help young people experiencing mental health problems make positive changes in their lives; and also fund work that ensures those working with young people with mental health problems, especially in general youth work settings, have access to good quality training to improve their skill base and confidence levels.
 - Domestic & Sexual Abuse - This programme aims to provide support for young people aged 11-25 who have witnessed or directly experienced domestic and sexual abuse.

Next deadlines for all the above programmes are 11 Jan & 21 May 2010.

The CEBF is currently offering limited financial support through grants for specific purposes. Once sufficient money has been raised it is intended to extend the service to include welfare support and advice on benefits; and a friendship network. Landfill Communities Fund (LCF): Update November 2009



This scheme supports a wide range of community and environmental projects, which should be within a specified distance of a licensed landfill site (LLS) and/or the facility of a company distributing grants under the LCF scheme e.g. Biffaward (list below). There are five categories of activities which can be supported:

- **Category A** - Reclaiming land, the use of which has been prevented by some previous activity
- **Category B** - Reduce or prevent pollution on land
- **Category D** - Provide or maintain public amenities or parks
- **Category DA** - Delivery of biodiversity conservation
- **Category E** - Restore or repair buildings of religious/architectural/ historical interest
