Directions:

From Junction 9 of the M20 - Join the A20 Maidstone Road following signs to the town centre until you reach the Ringway. Proceed round the Ringway past the Canterbury A28 turn and take the next exit, which is the A292 Mace Lane. Turn left into the Mace Industrial Estate (after Kwik-Fit turn) and proceed straight through the estate onto the Headley's site.

Rounds:

The rounds to be shot will be the Western, Short Junior Western and Burntwood Western, according to age and category of disability.

Eligibility: This tournament is open to all archers who are existing members of ArcheryGB and have a disability. ArcheryGB membership cards will need to be produced on the day.

The Rounds:

Physically Disabled:

Adults: Western
(4 doz. @ 60 yds. + 4 doz. @ 50 yds.)

Juniors: Short Junior Western
(4 doz. @ 30 yds. + 4 doz. @ 20 yds.)

Visually Impaired:

Adults: Burntwood Western
(4 doz. on 60 cm + 4 doz. on 80 cm @ 30 metres)

Juniors: Burntwood Western
(4 doz. on 80 cm + 4 doz. on 122 cm @ 15 metres)

Classifications for Shooting the Western Rounds:

The following classifications are as laid down by ArcheryGB, FITA and the IPC:

Archery Standing (ARST): Archers in the Standing Class have no disabilities in the arms. The legs show some degree of loss of muscle strength, co-ordination and/or joint mobility. Archers in this class may choose to compete sitting in an ordinary chair with their feet on the ground or standing.

Archery Wheelchair 1 (ARW1): Archers in the ARW1 class have a disability in their arms and legs (tetraplegia). They have limited range of movement, strength and control of their arms and poor or non-existing control of the trunk. The legs are considered non-functional, due to amputation and/or similar limitations of movement, strength and control. They compete in a wheelchair.

Archery Wheelchair 2 (ARW2): Archers in the ARW2 class have paraplegia and limited mobility in the lower limbs. These athletes require a wheelchair for everyday use and compete in a wheelchair.

Awards: Adults may shoot the junior round, subject to space availability, but this will not qualify for awards. Medals will be awarded according to the normal Kent Archery Association rules, and so will be dependant on the number of entries received in each class. Trophies will be awarded, to retain for one year, subject to the level of sponsorship received.

Dress Code: GNAS dress regulations as shown in GNAS Rule 307 will apply as if this were a National Record Status tournament. Archers must wear plain dark green / white or officially registered alternative shooting colours. Archers are requested to observe the dress regulations until after the presentation of awards.
