This event is organised and hosted by the Kent Archery Association University of Kent, Canterbury with support from Kent County Council, KentSport Leisure and Olympics







Tournament Status: UK Record and Rose Award status has been granted.

Shooting will be strictly according to the GNAS Rules of Shooting.

Eligibility: Only archers affiliated to GNAS/ArcheryGB are eligible to shoot; proof of membership may be requested at the tournament. Entry to this tournament is limited to archers selected to represent their county.

Drug Testing:

This is a UK Record Status tournament. Archers will be liable for drug testing and competitors approached to give samples must comply.

If they refuse, that refusal will be treated as a positive result. Entries from archers under the age of 18 must be signed by a parent/guardian to

signify consent to their child being drug tested if approached.

The Rounds: York, Hereford and all Bristol rounds according to the gender and age of the competitor. All competitors will be required to shoot the standard round for their gender and age (as shown below) as a minimum.

Timina: Shooting will be in two ends each of 3 arrows in 21/2 minutes in accordance with GNAS rule 304(f)(i) method 1 – the traditional way!

Targets:

Target butts are constructed from bound straw ropes and are of British manufacture; 3-leg stands will be used.

Dress Code: Dress regulations as shown in GNAS Rule 307 will apply, but county shooting colours or traditional dark green / white are preferred. Archers are requested to observe the dress code until after presentation of awards.

Awards:

All awards will be based on the results submitted by team captains at the end of shooting; they must therefore be treated as provisional until final results are published.

Rose Awards: This tournament has 'Rose Award' status and competitors wishing to claim an award, must do so before they leave the venue.

Lost Arrows: The tournament is held on a mixed-use sports field; all lost arrows must be found before their owner leaves the venue.

From the A2 turn on to the A2050, signposted Canterbury town centre; After **1.8 miles** take the first exit at roundabout - signposted to the university: After 0.2 miles turn left onto A290 - signposted Blean and University; After **0.9 miles** turn right into University Road;

After **0.6 miles** turn right into Giles Lane;

After 0.1 miles turn left into Parkwood Road and continue straight on 0.6 miles.

Please observe the 20 m.p.h. speed limit throughout the campus at all times.

Parking: Parking space will be clearly indicated; please park considerately and do not leave vehicles on any roadway.

The main parking area is at the far end of the field as you arrive; the car park next to the Pavilion is reserved for tournament officials and disabled archers only.
